About 4evergreen

<u>4evergreen</u> is a cross-industry alliance perfecting the circularity of fibre-based packaging to contribute to a climate-neutral and sustainable society. Our goal is to raise the overall recycling rate of fibre-based packaging to 90% by 2030. We bring a particular focus on packaging with a lower circularity performance today, namely the types used for household, out-of-home and onthe-go consumption.

The alliance brings together over 110 industry leaders from across the fibre-based packaging value-chain, from pulp, paper and board manufacturers and recyclers to packaging producers and converters, including brand owners, retailers, and waste management companies. It also comprises non-fibre material suppliers (e.g., adhesives, inks, coatings), technology providers (e.g., machinery, collection, and recycling solutions), leading research institutes and start-ups.

Together they share expertise to develop tools and guidelines for an even more sustainable sector. Their goal is to reach a 90% recycling rate for fibre-based packaging by 2030. Overall, our members employ 4.9 million people all over the world, with a consolidated annual turnover of over 2.4 trillion euros. All our members have set ambitious targets, clearly showcasing their commitment to addressing the most pressing global challenges.
