Can caring for the environment begin in a classroom, on a school playground or during a group cycling trip? At the School, Sports and Arts Complex in Radlin, students will discover that even small actions taken every day can have a real impact on nature and air quality.

Organised under the motto “Plant an Idea. Sow the Future.”, the event will take the form of a week of environmental activities combining education, practical action and cooperation within the entire school community. The programme includes a range of initiatives showing that investing in nature begins with knowledge, responsible choices and collective engagement.

One of the key elements of the event will be environmental workshops for fifth-grade students, as well as educational activities organised within the school’s after-school programme. During these sessions, children will explore topics related to environmental protection, clean air and the role of greenery in our surroundings. A special part of the programme will be a workshop titled “The Great Replanting – Why Do Peace Lilies Improve Our Well-being in the Classroom?”, during which students will learn how plants influence indoor microclimates and the well-being of people who spend time around them. Planting and caring for greenery together will become an opportunity to discuss the importance of plants in everyday life.

The event will also include a plant exchange, where students, teachers and local residents will share plants they have grown themselves. This initiative will allow plants to find new homes and classrooms while encouraging participants to exchange knowledge and experiences related to plant care.

Another important element of the programme will be a community clean-up action in the area surrounding the school, showing students how collective effort can positively influence the appearance and quality of public spaces. In addition, students participating in the after-school programme will take part in a mini cycling rally, promoting physical activity and encouraging the use of bicycles as an environmentally friendly means of transport.

The week of environmental activities at the Radlin school demonstrates that investing in nature begins with small steps taken in everyday school life. Planting greenery together, taking care of shared spaces and choosing environmentally friendly forms of activity help build awareness that everyone can contribute to protecting the environment and shaping the future of their community.
